

Adult Learner Admission Checklist

We are pleased that you have decided to further your education at UW-Marquette. The following information will help keep you on track through the admission and registration process.

Application

Complete the Application for Undergraduate Admission found at <https://apply.wisconsin.edu>. If you prefer, a paper application is also available.

This application serves many types of students. Therefore, some of the questions may seem inappropriate for adult learners, i.e. information about parents. This information is required for determining residency for tuition purposes.

Application Fee

If you submit the admission application online, you can pay the \$44 application fee online. You can also pay with a check, payable to the University of Wisconsin-Marquette. Your application is not considered complete until this fee is received.

Transcripts

Submit an official copy of your high school transcript. Call your high school to request an official transcript be sent directly to our admissions office. If you have obtained a GED or HSED, you may submit a copy of the diploma or test scores.

If you have attended college in the past, you must submit an official transcript from the previous campus(es). Contact the registrar's office at the former campus and request that the transcript(s) be sent directly to:

Placement Testing

UW-Marquette requires placement testing in math and English. Test results are used in the advising process to make sure you are placed into classes that are appropriate for you. These placement tests have no bearing on admission and are available on campus or online.

Once you have been admitted and taken the placement test you will be able to register for classes. All new students are required to meet with an advisor prior to registering for classes.
